

Newborough Liaison Partnership Meeting

Background

Aim

The aim agreed at the last meeting, for the engagement process is:

"To work with all those interested in the design, management and use of the Newborough Forest and Warren area, to enhance its environmental, economic and social value in the long term".

Issues discussion

When thinking about the key issues for the area, what do you, and the interests you represent, think are the three or four:

- greatest *opportunities* that need to be considered in order to enhance the environmental, economic and social value of the area
- issues on which opinion seems most *divided*, or on which there may be a *conflict* of interests, that will need to be considered
- most vital pieces of *information, research etc* that need to be considered or gathered.

Issues you put forward can be anything from 'on the ground' issues such as types of tree cover to 'values' issues such as peace and quiet and 'process' issues such as involvement of local people.

You may also wish to refer to the consultation summary report which identifies issues that those in the public consultation raised. Sections 3 - 7 in the report may be most relevant.

Future meeting agenda items

It is envisaged that the next meeting(s) will address the following sorts of questions:

- What is the role of the Liaison Partnership in the process and how else should we organise ourselves to achieve the above (eg task and finish groups and their focus, public meetings etc)?
- How do we involve the full range of interests including local, indigenous people, young people (see list from first meeting)
- Who should be part of what (including the Liaison Partnership, task and finish groups etc)
- Setting up task and finish groups
- Information sharing within the Liaison Partnership and within task and finish groups

How might we work together?

These proposals attached have been put forward by Lindsey Colbourne to start discussions on the best way of organising the way forward.

They are based on the assumption that as yet, no-one person or interest can know the best way of enhancing the social, environmental and economic value of the area long term.... Although almost everyone will have ideas, and everyone has part of the solution to contribute. So we need a way of working through the issues and views to identify actions that can be taken quickly and easily, and form an opinion about the bigger issues that will affect the area.
